# Regulations

Exhibitors are requested to read these conditions carefully.

ENTRY FEES ARE GST INCLUSIVE. TAX INVOICES ISSUED UPON REQUEST.

Conducted under the Rules and Regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies.

- 1. Entries must be made on the forms supplied by the Association.
- 2. It is essential for the smooth running of the show that entries for all sections be lodged with entry fee, with the Secretary on or before the dates shown at the heading of the respective sections. SUCH LATE ENTRIES AS THE COMMITTEE MAY, AT THEIR DISCRETION ACCEPT, WILL BE PENALISED DOUBLE THE FULL ENTRY FEE.
- 3. Exhibits in all classes must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor with exception of Section 1.
- 4. Entries must be accompanied by the entrancefee as specified in the schedule; otherwisethey will not be accepted.
- 5. No person shallbe allowed in the vicinity of the judge during judging, other then the stewards and attendants actually in charge of stock, and no person will be allowed to communicate with the judge other then a steward.
- 6. On the receipt of entries the Secretary will issue exhibit tickets, which must be the only sign of ownership attached to any exhibit, and such ticketsmust accompany exhibits. Exhibit tickets for livestock exhibitsmay be held by the stewardsattheir discretion and issued when exhibits are being penned.
- 7. No person shall act as judge, except in classes which he himself is not an exhibitor.
- 8. Judges may withhold prizes and championship honours if they think it expedient.
- 9. The decisions of the judges shall be final.
- 10. The committee reserves he right to withhold or modify any prize or prizes should there be three rless individual competitors in any class event.
- 11. Prize ribbons and tickets shall be affixed to exhibits as soon as the judges have made their awards.
- 12. Every care will be taken of exhibits, but the society will not be responsible for any loss or deaths, and exhibits must be brought to and removed from the ground by the exhibitor.
- 13. Exhibits must be delivered at the showgrounds and in the manner and at times specified at the heading of each section.Non- compliance with this provision will result in non-acceptance of the exhibits and forfeiture of entry fees
- 14. Prize moneys will ordinarily be paid at the show,but prizes/trophies not awarded, prizemoneys unclaimed, or prize cheques unpresented within six months of the show will revert to the society.
- 15. Judges and stewards may transfer any exhibit from any one class to another.
- 16. The right is reserved to reject any exhibit or exhibits which may be considered not of sufficient merit to be displayed.
- 17. Membership fees as follows: \$10.00/adult, children free
- 18 Special prizes donated, but not competed for, will not be refunded, but the donor shall have the option of allotting them as special prizes for the succeeding year.
- 19. The society reserves the right to adjudicate on any pointor points whichmay be under dispute, and the society's decision shall be final.
- 20. Not withstanding anything contained in the Rules and Conditions, the Committee may at their discretion alter any condition, cancel or substitute and/oralter any eventor class in the Scheduleif they considerit necessary to do so.
- 21. Competitors in ring events must have their horses in the assembly yard no later than 15 minutes prior to the commencement of the event. Any exhibitor not being present with his or her horse at the time of roll call which willtakeplace five (5) minutes before the commencement of the event, will not be permitted to compete in such an event. After the roll call the Steward in charge of the assembly yard will advise the ringmaster of the number of competitorspresent and ready to compete in the event about to take place.
- 22. For the start of an event, if a horse should break, a warning will be given, and if the same horse breaks again the entry will be scratched. No reduction in nomination fees will be allowed for more than 1 nomination in any one or moreclasses. Ponies competing in any pony events must be riddenor led by a childunder 18 years of age, unless otherwise stated. The age of childrencompeting will be taken as at the first day of the show.
- 23.2.Galloways or ponies entered in any class for which a prescribed height is a condition must be measured by the official measurer. Height of galloways being 14 and under 15 hands. The official measurer will attend the show grounds at10amon the day of the show. When measuring a galloway or pony, an allowance of one quarter (1/4) inch is to be made for shoes.

# SECTION1 - Horses

**Chief Steward:** Cara Haig (0407 756 174) or Liz Land (4655 1587) **Entry fees:** Stall/yards to all competition horses are free. A condition of entry is that all horses are to be made available for swab tests if required by the stewards.

#### ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

- The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Society/Association in addition to any Special Regulations which appear within this schedule.
- In the event of insufficient competitors in the Ring events classes may be run off earlier than stated in the Schedule. Please check with the Ring Steward.
- Nominations must be placed with the secretary and a nomination form filled in before commencement of events. Competitors will then be given tickets to use in the ring.
- All horses may need to be measured before commencement of events. Life measurements will be accepted with proof provided. An allowance of one-quarter (1/4) of an inch is to be made for shoes.
- Absolutely no responsibility shall be taken for prize money once competitors leave the ring.
- Free stalls/yards to all competition horses. Free Camping for competitors.
- This Show reserves the right to carry out random tests for drugs in horses.

#### REGULATIONS

- Horse to mean gelding or mare.
- For the purpose of this entire section, the following definitions will apply.

**Maiden:** a horse or rider which has never won a first prize (excluding teams) at any agricultural show.

**Novice:** a horse or rider which has not won an open champion or first at a royal show excluding maiden events.

Galloway: A Galloway is a horse measuring over 14hh but not exceeding 15hh.

- All horses must be free of hereditary disease.
- All riders must be neatly attired. Any contestant who, in the opinion of the Stewards, is not suitably attired, shall be precluded from competing in an event.
- Entrants in Adult events must be 18 years or over.
- Entrants in Children's or Pony events must be under 18 years of age. (except led pony classes)
- For Championship events, first in the class only is eligible for the championship. Second prize winners in such classes to be held ready then after champion has been selected, the second in to compete for the reserve champion.
- A local rider/horse is defined as a resident within the boundaries of the Paroo & Bulloo Shires for three months prior to the Show.
- In all rider classes and sporting events, competitors are eligible only to compete in their age groups.



- All horses and riders are to compete under the guidelines and c Federation of Australia.
- In all events rider must wear a safety helmet of approved Australian Standards.
- Points to be allocated from relevant events will be as follows: First 5 points, Second 3 points, Third 1 point. In the event of a tie, a count back of the greatest number of firsts shall determine the winner.
- The Judge's and Steward's decision shall be final.
- In the event of a protest the person making the protest shall make the same in writing to the Chief Steward accompanied by the fee of \$50.00, this sum to be refunded should the protest be upheld.
- All competitors must complete a Horse Health Declaration which must be handed into stewards upon purchase of ring tickets.
- This event will comply with necessary COVID plans and regulations as current on the day.

# **SECTION 3 - Sheep**

#### STUD SHEEP

Chief Steward: Jim McKenzie (Ph: 4655 4911) Sheep Secretary: Trish McKenzie Stewards: Andrea McKenzie, Chloe Dyer, John Peskett & Cozette Burey. \*Please note that all Stud sheep entries must be accompanied by a fee of \$5.00 per sheep.

Stud sheep must be correctly penned by 7.45am Friday 26th May for Classification. Exhibitors must remain with their sheep until they are penned and exhibit cards attached to pens. Stud sheep are not to leave the pavilion before 4.00pm Saturday. All stud sheep must be from a Government Accredited Brucellosis Free flock. Accreditation Certificates will be checked. No Certificate - No entry - No discussion.

Exhibitors must also provide attendants for holding sheep in Divisions A to E for judging. Any exhibit may be offered at auction after judging if desired by the owner, at a time to be designated by the Stewards.

Stewards have the right to delete any classes in the event of judging time being limited.

#### AWARDS

Sashes Awarded For All Champion And Reserve Championships.

Ribbons for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class. Also a highly commended ribbon may be awarded at the Judges discretion trophies where stated. JUDGING will commence at 8.30am.

#### E.P. BERESFORD MEMORIAL CUP

The E.P. Beresford Memorial Cup has been donated by P.R. & S.C. BERESFORD for the most successful exhibitor in Divisions "A" to "D". The cup is to remain the property of the society, but a replica to be presented to the winner each year. Points to be awarded: First 3, second 2 and third 1 point. Should two or more competitors tie, points will be awarded for championships as follows: Champion 2 points, Reserve Champion 1 point. Should a tie remain Grand Champion 2 points, Reserve Grand Champion 1 point.

#### HOLDERS TROPHY

A perpetual trophy donated by Merrinong Pastoral Co, Dubbo for the Most Efficient Holder of Sheep. This contest is open to persons under the age of 25 years. Annual Special Trophy donated by Hugh and Helen Miller.

#### SHEEP RULES

- 1. All sheep must be owned by the exhibitor.
- 2. In the event of any sheep found to have external parasites, the exhibitor will be required to remove all his sheep from the showgrounds immediately.
- 3. Sheep exhibits must not be removed from the Showgrounds until after the Grand Parade on the last day of the show.
- 4. In preparing their sheep for judging, exhibitors are required to remove or cover all distinguishing marks, such as horn brands, ear labels, etc. Until judging is finalised. Exhibit tickets must be the only sign of ownership.
- 5. No sheep can compete in more than one class, except where especially provided.
- 6. Prizes will not be awarded unless the judges decide the exhibit is of sufficient merit to warrant the honour.
- 7. In all group and pen classes of rams and ewes, except where otherwise stated, all sheep comprising such exhibits will be judged for uniformity of type, evenness of wool quality and conformity within each group or pen required for stud or flock breeding purposes.
- 8. In compiling aggregate awards, points scored shall be as follows:

Grand Champion - 2 points	Reserve Grand Champion - 1 point	
Champion - 2 points	Reserve Champion - 1 point	
First in single classes - 3 points	Second in single classes - 2 point	Third in singles classes - 1 poin
First in pens - 4 points	Second in pens - 3 points	Third in pens - 2 points
First in groups - 5 points	Second in groups - 4 points	Third in groups - 3 points

In addition to the above Rules, conditions apply to particular divisions are printed therein and exhibitors are respectfully requested to look for any special conditions applying to their entries. Stewards have the power to remove Unhoused Fat and Commercial Sheep out from under cover if necessary.

#### DEFINITIONS OF A POLL MERINO RAM AND EWE

Standard to be observed when Poll merinos are being exhibited at competitive shows or offered for sale as Stud Polls.

- 1. For a ram to be classed as a Poll Merino ram, it must:
  - a. Be sired by a Poll Merino ram or Merino ram out of a Poll Merino Ewe or Merino Ewe
  - b. Have a concavity in the bone of the skull on the horn site. A bone knob or small scar may be set in the concavity of the skull
  - c. Not have a scar or bone knob either of which measures more than 25mm in diameter across the widest part of its base.
- 2. For a ewe to be classed as poll a Merino ewe, it must:
  - a. Be sired by a Poll Merino ram or Merino ram out of a Poll Merino ewe or Merino ewe,
  - b. Have a concavity in the bone of the skull on the horn site.
  - c. Have no sign of any horn growth or bone knob set in the concavity.

O'Brien Memorial Trophy, donated by Pos Peskett).

18. Poll Merino Breeders Group, for 3 rams and 2 ewes bred by the exhibitor which may be extracted from any classes in Division C and D. Sheep shall be judged from uniformity of wool and conformation. There must be a minimum of three breeder groups in this class, otherwise it will not be held. (Trophy donated by Ms Ann Leahy, MP.).

19. The Cunnamulla And District Show Society's Perpetual "Artesian" Stud Merino Sheep Trophy, for the best exhibit of 5 Merino sheep, either horned or polled, to consist of 3 rams and 2 ewes bred by the exhibitor, which must be selected from the general classes and judged for type, wool quality and conformity. The five sheep in this exhibit need not have the same wool spinning count. There must be a minimum of three exhibits in this class, otherwise it will not be held.

will be made available on the following conditions: to be won 3 times in succession. (A token trophy will be presented to the winner of this class).
